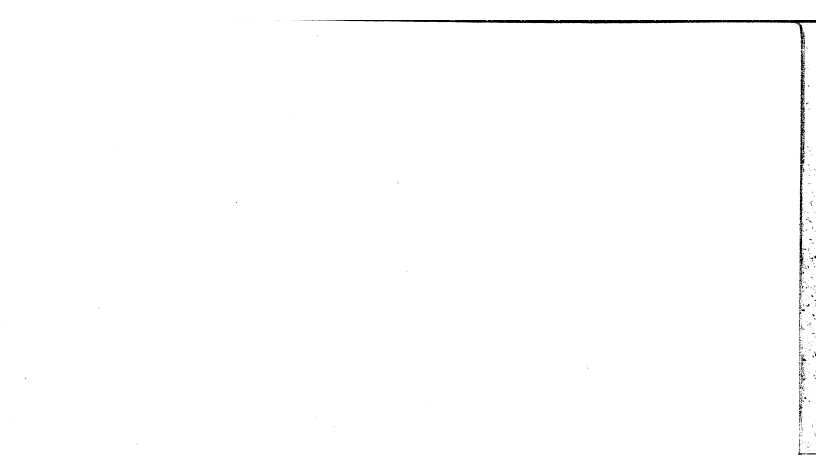


The names in this edition from Page 195 to 211 inclusive were printed

The P R E F A C E.

THE Art of *DANCING*, called by the ancient Greeks *Orchestice*, and *Orchestis*, is a commendable and rare Quality fit for young Gentlemen and Ladies, if opportunely and civilly used. And *Plato*, that famous Philosopher, thought it meet, That young ingenious Children be taught to Dance. It is a Quality that has been formerly honoured in the Courts of Princes, when performed by the most noble Hero's of the Times, The *Gentlemen* of the *Inns of Court*, whose sweet and airy Activity has crowned the Grand Solemnities with Admiration to all Spectators. This Art has been anciently handled by *Athenæus*, *Julius Pollux*, *Cælius Rhodigiæus*, and others, who much commended it to be excellent for Recreation, after more serious Studies, making the Body more active and strong, graceful in Deportment, and a Quality very much befitting a Gentleman. And now the former Impression being sold off, I have in this Eighth Edition (with the Assistance of a knowing Friend in this Art) left out some of the old *Dances* but in their places added twice as many new ones never before printed. The whole, as it is now corrected and Published, I doubt not but will be kindly accepted by all Ingenious Lovers of this *ART*: Which is the hearty Desire of

This Dance is began by a single Person, (either Man or Woman) who taking a Cushion in his hand dances about the Room, and at the end of the Tune he stops, and sings, *This Dance it will no farther go.* The Musician answers, *I pray you good Sir, why say you so?* Man. *Because Joan Sanderfon will not come to.* Music. *She must come to, and she shall come to, and she must come whether she will or no.* Then he lays down the Cushion before a woman, on which she kneels, and he kisses her, singing, *Welcom Joan Sanderfon, welcom, welcom.* Then she rises, takes up the Cushion, and both dance, singing, *Prinkum-prankum is a fine Dance, and shall we go dance it once again, once again, and once again, and shall we go dance it once again?* Then making a stop, the wo. sings, as before, *This Dance, &c.* Music. *I pray you, Madam, &c.* Woman. *Because John Sanderfon, &c.* Music. *He must, &c.* And so she lays down the Cushion before a man, who kneeling upon it, salutes her, she singing, *Welcom John Sanderfon, &c.* Then he taking up the Cushion, they take hands and dance round, singing as before: And thus they do till the whole Company are taken into the Ring: And then the Cushion is laid before the first man, the woman singing, *This Dance, &c.* (as before,) only instead of — *come to*, they sing — *go fro*; and instead of *Welcom John Sanderfon, &c.* they sing, *Parewel John Sanderfon, farewell, farewell*: And so they go out one by one as they came in. Note, That the woman is kiss'd by all the men in the Ring at her coming in and going out, and likewise the man by the women.
