

# **Shared Magic**

for 2 guitars

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Performance notes:

The pieces are meant to be performed as a group, in the order they are presented in the score. Never publicly play a *selection* from this work, unless the selection is of a *single piece*, in which case it is permissible.

In any section that is repeated, the performers may exchange parts for the duration of the repeat, and if they wish, the rest of the piece as well, or until the parts are exchanged again during another repeated section. The music will also benefit from one or both performers using alternate tuning(s) for their instrument(s) to facilitate certain passages, thus creating new sonorities when playing together. Different tunings may be used for different pieces.

Durations, particularly in arpeggiated chords, are example realizations. Performers may choose to shorten some notes and lengthen others. Such decisions may be based not only on personal taste, but also on the tuning chosen for the work, and various practical considerations.
