ANI's Papyrus outlines the Book of Dead. It begins with 'Homage to thee who hast come' to the funeral ceremony as first theme. 'May God give splandor to thee' gives tributes as second theme. 'Hail Gods' gives tribute to Gods as third theme. 'Praise to RA' gives special tribute to the Sun God as 4th theme. Narration 'The House of the Prince ...' comes as the 5th theme.

'mayst tou be at piece with me' says the dead at 6th theme. 'May there be placed offerings for me...' prays the dead as 7th theme.

The funeral procession defends the dead in front of Gods as 8th theme.

'I am in thy presence Lord of Amentet.' says the dead in front of Gods and defends himself as 9th theme. He strives to be accepted to the other world.

The procession sings that the dead should be accepted as 10th theme and a chorale sings 'May he go in with confidence' as 11th theme.

1st theme recaps with 'May be done his (dead person) commands, May he walk, May he speak to you...'

12th theme states 'Not have been defect there'.

7th theme recaps with stronger pleads 'May be given to me my mouth'. 13th the dead pays 'Homage to thee Lord of radience'.

The dead says 'I came to thee, I am glorius, I am pure' and states his wishes 'may I follow my heart ...' as 14th theme. The speaker closes the oratorio with a few appropriate words.

Note: The term theme is not used as its strict meaning. Rather it is used as group of closely related elements.
