\* This overture was performed for the first time in the opera *Il geloso in cimento* (Vienna, Burgtheater, 25 May 1774) and re-performed in Venice (Teatro S. Samuele, autumn 1774). It was later misnamed as *Sinfonia Venezia* in 1997.
